

In 2018, I had a time of immersion and took an English course in Australia. I lived with our sisters in Brisbane. That time gave me a beautiful experience of the spirit of Saint Angela as lived by our sisters in Australia. With two other sisters from Indonesia, I also visited the sisters in the Netherlands. I was amazed at their love for the province of Indonesia – we in Indonesia know that God loves all the missionaries from the Netherlands. After tertianship, I returned to Indonesia and continued as treasurer for the school and the community at St. Ursula's in Jakarta. At the end of October 2020, I came to Rome for the transition period to my new mission as general treasurer. May our unity with each other produce abundant good fruits so that God will be glorified. THANKS TO SR ARMIDA

ON THE DAY OF 120TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE ROMAN UNION

On Saturday, 28 November 2020, we had a special double celebration at the Generalate and we will probably remember the atmosphere of that day for a long time.



First, the 120th anniversary of the foundation of the Roman Union in 1900. Pope Leo XIII expressed the wish to see all Ursulines united under the authority of one Superior General

living in Rome. After this, 62 of the monasteries decided to join the Union and they received the verbal approval of the Holy Father on November 28. Since the beginning of the Roman Union in 1900, other communities have joined and new provinces been established. Our internationality requires us to develop our thoughts on our unity in diversity so as to be a sign of unity in an often divided world.

Second, thanks to our dear Sr Armida Veglio, who is finishing her role as Secretary General and her time at the Generalate.

Due to the pandemic the number of guests who could be invited was limited. However, Sr Jane Livesey CJ, our collaborators Antonella and Emanuela, Sr. Angela Poggi OSU, the two sisters from Nomentana 34 and three of the MSC priests were present. We celebrated a solemn Mass at 11.00 a.m. which included chants accompanied by our novices and the intercessory prayer in different languages.

During the homily Fr Chris Chaplin MSC, referring to the Gospel, said that the beauty of living a perfect balance or harmony between Unity and Diversity is that it gives the most sublime witness to the true nature of God and that this is the task/calling of our Roman Union - balance and harmony.



Fr Chris said thank you to Sr Armida, too, for her capacity to step in and be the voice of balance and harmony.

After the Mass we continued with pre-lunch drinks and then a festive lunch. There was then a surprise for Sr Armida in the form of a performance.




It was a short story about her stay in Rome, rich in various experiences and numerous meetings with sisters.

IN MEMORY OF SR THÉRESSIA FONSOU

On Sunday 20 September 2020, Sr **Théressia Fonsou** celebrated her 50th anniversary of profession in St Nicolas' Church on the island of Tinos. The same evening she died suddenly and went to the Father's embrace.

Here are some extracts from what she shared with everyone during the Mass of thanksgiving that morning.

“To all of you who have expressed your love and your closeness to me on the occasion of my 50th anniversary of religious life, I address a very warm and friendly THANK YOU. It is so wonderful and so good to feel united in prayer and love despite distances. It is so good to thank God with others and to have only one heart to recognise the greatness of the love of God in our life and to be able to sing with the Church “I have come to meet you.”

...
Yes, the Lord, my spouse, loved me unto the Cross and he called me to follow him and to be in communion with his Paschal Mystery, at the cost of little difficulties, little crosses, so that others might feel that, in return, one can offer love in suffering, consolation in trials, closeness in solitude.

I thank the sisters of my religious family who by their presence and the witness of their lives have helped me to go forward each day and still today, on the path of the religious life... the children and the young people who by their enthusiasm and their spontaneity in the summer camps and catechism classes led me and lead me still in the gift of myself renewed in joy...

I thank you all, ... you have loved me as an Ursuline religious and you have often said it, particularly during the lectio divina, when, for example, at the beginning of my illness, I was kept in Athens, you left the telephone open so that I could hear and participate in the prayers. Is this not the Church?

I thank you, priests with whom I have collaborated in the same vineyard ... this Church in which, with you, I feel I carry a responsibility.

No, not more than any other kind of life, the religious life is not easy, but it's worth it! Now, the more the years pass, and the more I deepen the Lord's call, his Love and the gift of this unique Love to which no other love can be compared, but we must witness to it in the right way. And, as St Angela told us, “provided they believe, and do not lose heart and hope, may they put their hope and their love in God alone... Have hope and firm faith in God, for he will help you in everything. » (Counsels), even my « infirmity », I consider it as a gift : He gives, He takes away, may his Name be blessed!

To all, I wish that in your life you have this personal encounter with Christ, that we have the courage to leave our boat and to seek ... another sea, with Him, relying only on his strength, on his look of love, on his call and so we will hear him say to us « Maria Théressia », go and tell my brothers and sisters, the young people, the children that you have met me then « come, follow me » just as you are!...”

CENTENARY OF THE SCHOOL COMMUNITY OF LARGENTÉ IN BAYONNE

1990-2020 : a birthday marking the arrival of the Ursulines in Bayonne in France. It began under the gaze of Saint Angela and continued in 2021, due to the pandemic.

On Monday 27 January 2020, the feast of Saint Angela, the school community of Largenté launched its centenary celebration. It was a wonderful day with our 1500 students from the nursery school right up to the post-secondary.

The students, divided into intergenerational groups, took part in a celebration presided over by Mgr Aillet, Bishop of Bayonne, in the presence of Sr Brigitte Brunet, Provincial of France-Belgium-Spain



Everyone shared a picnic before enjoying the concerts and games.

Let us go back to the first hours of the Ursulines at Largenté through what was written by Fr. Aguer, chaplain of the Ursuline community:

“It was Monday 3 January 1920, It was snowing on... Bayonne. 3 nuns got off the Irun Paris train, with some unusual equipment: a trunk, a pickaxe, a rake, a broom, half a dozen apples... In the evening, we will see them visiting an estate on the heights of Marracq. A strange estate which was accessed by large alleys of 4 rows of plane trees. (...) A pickaxe for Sister Saint-Ignace, a rake for Sister Marie-Julienne, a broom for Sister Claire... A few apples that they shared in a friendly way: thus began the story of the boarding school Largenté.

The next day, in a small weeded square, the first seed was sown of an educational work that would quickly prosper. A very insignificant seed, a pea, a simple little pea ...

(...) Peas... a symbol, an image? It doesn't matter... It was the first seed of this work, humbly created, somewhere over there near Marracq ”. 10 months later, on 12 October 1920, the first pupils arrived.

Thus the community of Ursulines, originally from Saint Sever in the Landes, continued its educational work with an exile of some years in Zarautz in the Spanish Basque country.

Very quickly Largenté became a boarding school for young girls which brought in pupils from both the Landes and the Basque Country. A vibrant Ursuline community was growing there. It had up to sixty religious in the 1950s, when the current chapel was also built.

The beginning of the 1970s corresponded to major changes for the establishment: the arrival of co-education, tertiary baccalaureates, the growing presence of lay teachers who followed the path traced by the Ursuline sisters. The principal of the time Sister Saint Jacques invited people who would actively participate in the development of the establishment and in the vitality of the Merician network at the national level: Michel Saint Genez and Dominique Hiribarren.

Today Largenté is a flagship of Catholic education in the diocese of Bayonne, welcoming, in 2020, 1,500 students from kindergarten to higher education. The Ursuline community will close in a few months, but the Merician roots will always be present thanks to

the laity still engaged today in this mission with young people of various backgrounds.


A section to invite you to read...

1. *Testimony about the book "Angela" by Janice Howard (from the September 2020 issue of "Bearings" the bulletin of the Province of Australia.)*

At that time (1989), a great deal of correspondence came from Ursuline sisters or from newspapers in response to the book 'Angela', by Janice Howard (Australia).

A more recent one came from Iliana in Greece:

“... I finished reading [it] last week.



I am still thinking about it...although I had some knowledge about St Angela's life I think that this book made her personality alive...

I liked the "subtitle*" very much, facing two alternatives and seeing a third... I am thinking that this must have been incredible for the 16th century. She was a "feminist" but in a different way that we mean the word today. I think that she wished for other women to be able to live a religious life like she did. A life similar to her own and she brought them together. This way of life is much easier to do today, for a woman, to decide how she wants to live, at least in some parts of the world.

2. *"Un consultant chez les religieuses" (A Consultant to religious) by Mr. Matthieu DAUM, Salvator 2020 Editions. Thanks to Sr Armida Veglio for this article.*

"A kind of autobiographic essay on my work with religious congregations, telling the stories of both the organisational transformation that I ended up facilitating, and my own transformation, or spiritual conversion, in doing this work. All names of course have been changed, to preserve confidentiality - except mine and those of my colleagues!"

At the end of my reading this book, I can only describe it as a spiritual autobiography.

Matthieu describes clearly and openly his journey of faith from childhood to the present, the moments of struggle, the moments of desolation, as well as the moments of joy and consolation.

I was struck by his openness and honesty in writing about his family as well as his reactions to specific aspects of the Church. He describes his finding God's presence through the different phases of his life, his professional life as



I was a pupil at the Ursuline High School and I must admit that I am not really a person of faith. Angela Merici's writings, the words that she left for the Ursulines, are a wonderful text and I cannot put into words why I feel that. There is a presence, a warmth, a big embrace in this text.

I am thinking that perhaps today is not so much different than her time but in another way. The restrictions are of a completely different nature now...

psychiatric nurse, as management consultant and as facilitator for religious congregations.

An important theme is "kenosis" – the ability to let go of what is no longer life-giving, in our personal lives, as family or community, as congregation, as Church. Letting go in order to find fuller life.

The religious congregations with whom Matthieu has worked have had their names changed in the book. It is clear how much each of them have given to Matthieu and how much he has given to them, on an organizational and practical level, but much more importantly on a spiritual level.

Those of us who participated in the General Chapter of 2019 experienced Matthieu's manner of facilitation and several provinces have also benefitted from his guidance. We recommend this book to all our sisters. For the moment it is in French, but we encourage Matthieu to have some translations for the benefit of a wider audience.
