Mother Dominica du Sacré-Cœur Jacquart (Luc Darmès) Composer – A lifelong passion.

The video traces the musical activity of Mother **Dominica du Sacré-Cœur, osu (Berthe Jacquart)** through the many music sheets for voice and instrument that have come down to us. The daughter of merchants from Brittany, Berthe studied with the **Ursulines of Vitré** and then became one of them, taking the name Dominica du Sacré-Coeur. Dedicated to music since childhood, inspired by Saint Agnes, ‘the great musician from Paradise’, as she liked to call her, she embraced her vocation by expressing it through her **passion for music** that nourished her spirit and produced numerous compositions of **holy music**. Having moved to the Netherlands following the French expulsion laws, Dominica continued her apostolate in schools as a music teacher, alongside her activity as a composer under the **pseudonym Luc Darmès**, a name we often find on her music sheets, both manuscript and published. In addition to holy music, her production also includes **exercises** designed for both students and teachers. So great was her devotion to music that she was willing to contribute, in her own small way, with a donation to purchase the organ for the chapel of the new Generalate in Rome in 1932. She died the following year in Redon, France, aged just 52.

Text video

Berthe Jacquart (La Guerche de Bretagne 1881 – Redon 1933)

- Daughter of merchants from Brittany
- Studied at the Ursulines of Vitré
- She took the habit in 1902 and her first vows in 1904
- Following the expulsion laws she was received by the Ursulines of Maastricht where she made her perpetual profession in 1906
- She returned to France in 1919 and applied for membership of the Roman Union. The same year she was received by the Ursulines of St Omer in Tournai
- Music teacher (organ and piano)

‘Very intelligent, excellent musician, talented composer. Very impressionable, very passionate nature, excellent heart’ (AGUUR, Ic, *Dossier des décès, ad nomen, passim*).
