### 18<sup>th</sup> January

Song to Saint Angela.

Song to Saint Angela.

"And if, according to times and circumstances, the need arises to make new rules or do something differently, do it prudently and with good advice..."

(Last Legacy, 2)

### 21<sup>st</sup> January

Song to Saint Angela.

"... dearly beloved daughters and sisters, God has granted you the grace of setting you apart from the darkness of this miserable world and of uniting you together to serve his divine Majesty, you have to thank Him infinitely that, to you especially, He has granted such a singular gift." (Prologue to Rule, 4-5)

# 22<sup>nd</sup> January
