Finally, on Epiphany, two sisters working at Wenzao Ursuline University joined faculty and students to share “*Galette des Rois*” (King’s Cake) and the biblical story of the Magi seeking Jesus. Everyone was encouraged to reflect on who the most important person in their life is and what their most precious gift might be.
